DG's REMARKS AT HIGH COMMISSIONER HEIDI BOOTLE'S FAREWELL BREAKFAST PORT VILA, 19th APRIL 2024

As Head of the MSG Secretariat, it would be remiss of me not to acknowledge with profound thanks the extensive development Programme that Australia has in Vanuatu in Education, Infrastructure, Human

Resource Development, Security (VMF, Police Force), Health, to name a few. These are products of the work of this individual that is leaving us shortly.

These are manifestations of the capacity of this individual's empathy towards Melanesia's prosperity and wellbeing, and readiness to make strong well-articulated representations to Canberra, for (the big wigs in) Canberra to hear our MSG concerns, aspirations and pleas.

Of considerable admiration to me is the propensity of this individual to hear me out on cooperative ideas or simply projects that I have conjured up, however crazy they may sound. With the kind assistance of Estelle Milfirer from the Vanuatu Bijouterie we were able to have a brooch made with the MSG logo on it.

The making of this gift has an interesting story to it.

We started with trying to melt silver coins from all MSG Members (Fiji, New Caledonia, PNG, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu) to make the brooch. (But alas!) They contained too much nickel and could not hold up well, so we abandoned the idea.

A special feature of the logo on your brooch is the **waves** below – or so I thought (Melle Florence Toka in 2009, the designer of the MSG logo, had the idea that these represented **a barbed spear** to symbolize the strength of Melanesian cultures and traditions). The official logo has only four (4) waves/barbs, but on your brooch, you have five (5) – to represent the five MSG Members.

Heidi, can I ask that you come forward and accept this gift from a grateful MSG family.
